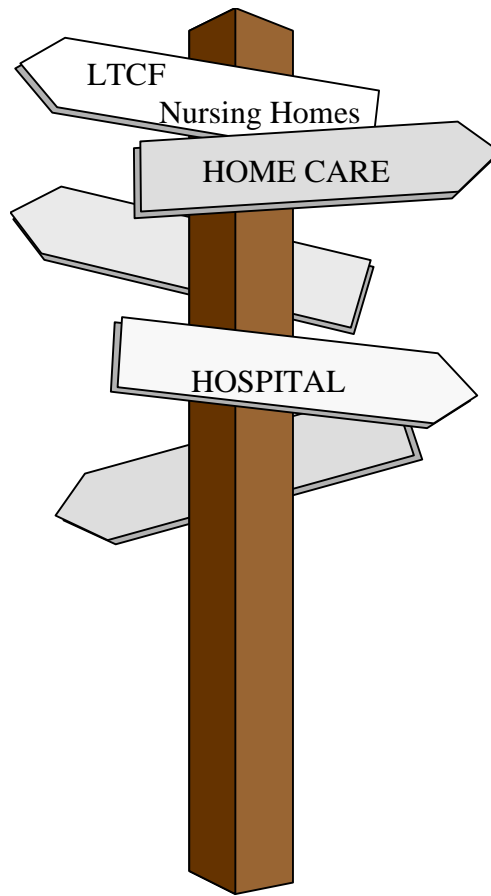


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Welcome

Attendance Policy

- I. 100% attendance is required by the State of Ohio in accordance with the Ohio Administrative code paragraph (D) of rule 3701-18-08. Trainees are required to make up all missed class, lab or clinical time. The State requires an hour for hour make-up. This however may not be feasible depending on the amount of time that the trainee has missed; therefore the trainee may be required to drop the course. All course work shall be completed within 60 (sixty) calendar days (Saturdays, Sundays and holidays included) If you are unable to make up the time within the sixty (60) days you will need to repeat the course at your own expense.
- II. All time to be made up must be completed within 60 calendar days. If unable to complete make-up within that stated 60 calendar days of the scheduled completion date of the class. **The student will need to repeat the class at the student's expense. If applicable the refund policy will be followed. There will be a fee for clinical make-up.**
- III. Tardiness of 15 minutes or greater is equal to one hour and the above make-up policy applies
- IV. . The refund policy will be followed according to the amount of class time attended.
- V. No children are allowed in class, lab or clinical.
- VI. NO Cell Phones are allowed in the classroom or clinical setting. To have a cell phone on is unprofessional and is considered unethical behavior (see early failure policy). Turn them off while in class/clinical. You may use them on your break.

Grading Policy

Grades

A = 90-100%

C = 70 – 79%

F = <59%

B = 80 – 89%

D = 60 – 69%

The trainee must pass this course with a 70% or higher to be eligible to take the STNA examination.

Early Failure Policy

The trainee may be removed from class, lab or clinical experience for unsafe or unethical behavior. If the trainee is removed for unsafe or unethical behavior, that trainee will receive a grade of an "F." The trainee will not be entitled to a refund.

Examples of such behaviors are: stealing, cheating, endangering patients, students, faculty or staff, or interruption of class or clinical by cell phone use or text messaging. These are just examples and are NOT all-inclusive.

Refund Policy

Included in the tuition of \$595 is a \$50, non-refundable registration fee. All refunds are based on The total cost of the course. Full refund is available up until the first day of class minus the \$50 dollar non-refundable registration fee. As of the first day of class refund is 75% Refund is based on \$545.00, (\$595.00 minus \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee). As of the second day of class refund is 50%. Because of the short length of the course after 2 days there is no refund. If the trainee is removed from the class because of the violations of early failure policy the trainee is not entitled to a refund.

Uniform Policy

Each trainee is expected to dress professionally. Professional dress means that the trainee will wear the following in:

CLINICAL:

1. White uniform top
2. Royal Blue uniform skirt or Royal Blue uniform pants.
3. Royal Blue uniform skirt must be knee length or longer but at least 3 inches above the ankle – for safety.
4. White shoes (no other colors present on shoes).
5. White sock or hose must be worn at all times.
6. No jewelry except wedding band and stud earrings. No more than three pairs of earrings allowed and must be worn in lower half of ear. No jewelry shall be worn in the nose, eyebrows, lips or tongue.
7. Hair must be clean and off the collar and out of the face. Facial hair must be trimmed and well groomed.
8. Fingernails must be no longer than ¼ inch beyond the finger tips. No false nails, over lays or nail jewelry.
9. Clear nail polish only.
10. ID badges must be worn and visible at all times.
11. Watch with a second hand.

CLASSROOM:

1. You may wear comfortable clothes in the classroom. However, NO offensive language or pictures, or bare midriffs allowed.
2. Shoes must be worn at all times

Closure Policy

Closure: Declaration of a Snow Emergency by local law enforcement agencies (Fairborn Police Department or Greene County Sheriff Department) or disaster services.

Delay: Temporary hazardous driving conditions; such as ice, fog or snow drifts.

Make-ups due to closures/delays: Class and/or clinical time must be made up. This will occur at the end of the scheduled course. Class or clinical will be extended day for day until course is completed in accordance with the Ohio Administrative Code.

Grievance Policy

The purpose of this policy is to provide a system for students to present their perceived grievance. It is to provide students who feel treated in an unfair, unethical or discriminatory manner the opportunity to present their grievances without fear of

censure or reprisal.

1. The student is to attempt to resolve any complaints or differences with the person involved directly, unless there is unusual mitigating circumstances, i.e. sexual harassment.
2. Submit a written complaint to the president of the School of Nurse Aide Training, Inc or the Vice-President.
 - a. This is to include the date, time, circumstances surrounding the alleged incident(s) and witnesses.
 - b. A copy will be given to the person with whom the alleged incident involves

Sexual Harassment Policy

The School of Nurse Aide Training, Inc. has a zero tolerance policy. In compliance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Sexual harassment is reprehensible and unacceptable. Sexual harassment is defined as an attempt to coerce an unwilling person into a sexual relationship or subject an individual into an unwanted sexual relationship whatever form it may take. Sexual harassment may include but not limited to unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, verbal visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature made by someone in the work or educational setting under any or all of the following conditions.

- Submission to the conduct is explicitly made a term or a condition of an individual's employment, academic status or progress.
- Submission to or rejection of the conduct by the individual influences decisions regarding employment, academic status or progress.
- The conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact upon the individual's work or academic performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment
- Continued expression of sexual interest after being informed that the interest is unwelcome.
- Steps to Stop sexual harassment
 1. Identify the offensive behaviors to the harasser and request that the behavior is stopped.
 2. Discuss the concern immediately with the appropriate person in authority, i.e. Faculty member, president of the School of Nurse Aide Training, Inc. or Vice-President.

Substance Abuse Policy

The purpose is to comply with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988. The school is committed to providing an environment that is conducive to learning. The abuse of alcohol and drugs can adversely affect the educational environment and clinical safety. Students who abuse substances are a danger to themselves and others. Students who display behaviors that are consistent with being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be dismissed from clinical or class immediately. It will be the students responsibility to provide documentation of a clean drug/alcohol test. The School of Nurse Aide Training, Inc. recognizes that alcohol and drug addictions are an illness and a health problem. The School of Nurse Aide Training, Inc. will assist students in finding a resource for their health problems.

GUILTY TO AN OFFENSE IN PARAGRAPH (E) OF THIS RULE.
